About the University

Fifty years of achievement have seen the University of Bath grow into a globally recognised institution with over 20,000 students from 153 countries. We believe in offering our students a well-rounded education: high quality teaching from research-led academics; placements as a feature of many of our undergraduate courses, supporting strong employability; a substantial and growing range of options for post-graduate study; and extra-curricular activities such as our award- winning sports. The result: a very engaged, high-quality student body with strong values, impressive achievements, and excellent levels of student satisfaction. We were named the 'University of the Year' and ranked 8th best university in the UK by The Times and The Sunday Times Good University Guide 2023.

Ours is a learning community, as students and academics work closely together in education and research. While this is frequently a transformative experience for students, the reach is very much wider, contributing to local and global understanding of the world in which we find ourselves. Our academics collaborate across traditional and emerging subject areas so that our research has practical applications with social and economic benefit. We continue to invest in new facilities and people to grow the impact of our research. We make a positive contribution to our community and the vigour of our local economy, accounting for around £380 million Gross Value Added (GVA) in Bath and North East Somerset and £1.2 billion to the UK. We work closely with globally recognised as well as small and specialised industrial and commercial partners and our Innovation Centre grows new businesses

Based at the Bristol Bath Science Park, the <u>Institute for Advanced Automotive Propulsion Systems</u> (IAAPS) will be industry focused and compete on a global scale to support the UK in delivering transformational research in the years to come. Combining the world's best engineers with industry, underpinned by a track record in expertise and delivery from the University of Bath, IAAPS can help deliver the vehicles of the future, securing jobs and investment.

<u>The Milner Centre for Evolution</u> brings together our intellectual expertise in evolution research in this state-of- the-art research facility. This Centre asks the big evolutionary questions, finds new technological and clinical research applications, and takes evolutionary research into the community.

Led by the University of Bath, <u>The Institute of Coding</u> brings together universities, large corporates, small and medium sized enterprises, established industry groups, experts in the delivery of distance and non-traditional learning and professional bodies to develop and deliver innovative, industry-focused education across the UK.

A new high-profile International Olympic Committee (IOC) Research Centre to focus on injury prevention in sport will be based at the universities of Bath and Edinburgh. For over a decade, the University of Bath has been leading ground-breaking research to improve player safety in rugby. Major projects completed with England Rugby and World Rugby directly informed scrum law changes. Most recently, its development of the injury prevention programme, 'Activate', led to its global roll-out by World Rugby.


University Strategy

The role of Director of Sustainability

The University's published Strategy lists "Supporting a sustainable community" as one of its five Core Values and in addition stresses Sustainability as a key area of research focus. Sustainability is also a priority in Curriculum Transformation. The University's Strategy also references the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals (UN-SDGs). There are a number of leading sustainability initiatives already established, including the Climate Action Framework (CAF) and it's team which will report into this role.

Embedding sustainability into University operations is important. However, we also recognise that to make the biggest impact, we need to make informed choices which have the maximum impact per unit of investment, this being validated by data. A requirement of this post will be systematic thinking; an ability to build the right sustainability plans using robust tools, models and data sets to enable decisions to made. The plan should seek to ensure that institutional targets can be achieved in a cost-effective manner with maximum impact, and carbon savings should be routinely tracked and benchmarked. The role will be critical in enabling decision makers to assess feasibility and ease of integration with other programs. Following approval of plans, the Director of Sustainability will work with other leaders to ensure their successful delivery.

Working in partnership with other leaders across the institution, the Director of Sustainability is responsible for the planning, co-ordination and delivery of carbon-reduction activities overall across all areas of the University in order to meet our institutional commitments.

Key Responsibilities


- Establish a clear understanding of the University goals and targets for carbon-reduction activities, with the University's executive team, ensuring priorities are understood and shared by all.
- Lead on the embedding of Sustainability into the University's operation; reflecting agreed priorities and focusing on areas of the biggest impact.
- Develop a cost-effective plan for immediate and longer-term carbon and related wider sustainability interventions to meet institutional targets, using financial savings from interventions to allow continuing improvements to be made.
- Ensure delivery of the carbon reduction metrics previously agreed by the University's executive team, prioritising interventions on the basis of TCO2 saved/£ invested and £ saved/£ invested.
- Draw on data, both existing, and where necessary sourcing external input, to create clear insights into levels of current activities and opportunities for carbon savings.
- Create appropriate tools to enable data-driven decisions on carbon reduction activities. Work with
 colleagues in relevant areas (such as Finance and Planning/Projects Office) to ensure that
 approaches to the development of tools promotes and encourages the alignment of activities and
 goals.
- Implement appropriate reporting tools to track the success of sustainability initiatives.
- Work in collaboration with key stakeholders, including but not limited to Campus Infrastructure, Campus Services, Finance and Planning to identify and seize on opportunities that align with the sustainability agenda.
- Work with the Communications teams to ensure communications on the sustainability agenda support and are in line with institutional priorities.
- Provide information, insight and advice to senior leaders across the University on sustainability options, choices and impacts – in relation to the strategies they are delivering.

- Management of the CAF Team. Provide appropriate vision, advice, and guidance to support the successes of the team, and development those within it.
- Work with the Director of Campus Infrastructure to ensure any major infrastructure activities are supported to consider sustainability issues, in line with the above metrics, at an early stage.
- Support the University to consider it's position in relation to the United Nation's Sustainable
 Development Goals and how these might be used to impact our rankings.
- Keep abreast of developments in sustainability, including national policy and practice, issues
 affecting the HE sector, technology developments including relevant legislation, and informing
 strategy and delivery in the University accordingly.


- An expert collaborator, the individual will need to be able to recognise institutional priorities and help seize opportunities for carbon reduction
